
Kauai Water Use and Development Plan Update Public Informational Meeting October 2015

Hawaii Water Plan

The *Hawaii Water Plan* consists of 5 components:
(1) the *Water Resource Protection Plan* (WRPP),
(2) the *Water Quality Plan* (WQP)
(3) the *State Water Projects Plan* (SWPP)
(4) the *Agricultural Water Use and Development Plan* (AWUDP), and
(5) the County Water Use and Development Plans (WUDP). A separate WUDP is to be prepared by each of the four Counties.

Each component focuses on a specific objective and assesses elements summarized in the following table. Each County WUDP relies on the 4 other *Hawaii Water Plan* components for information on the specified elements and coordinates and integrates the information at the county level. The responsible agency and current status of the various components are also provided. The *Hawaii Water Plan* is a living document and many of these components are currently being updated.
